## The Keys of Spiritual Development

### The Benefits & Blessing of the Word of God

2 Timothy 3:16

**Introduction:** Before coming to the Scriptures for wisdom and guidance we must be convinced of their authority. We must also be persuaded that there is actual benefit in doing so before we will be motivated to read the Scriptures with purpose and persistence. Before even giving the application, Paul address both of these issues: *All Scripture is inspired by God AND profitable....* In this brief study we will examine the benefits and blessing of building God's Word into our lives.

#### I. God IS interested in our success in life. He desires us to live lives of purpose and blessing. Here are some of the words the Bible uses for lives well lived:

- A. Profitable—Prov 3:13-15; Is 44:9-11; Jn 6:63; Acts 20:18-21; I Tim 4:7-8; Heb 4:2
- B. Successful—Gen 39:2; Joshua 1:7&8
- C. Satisfied and Contented—Deut 6:6-12; Ps 91:14-16; Luke 6:20-21; I Tim 6:6-11
- D. Great Gain—I Tim 6:6-11; Phil 3:8-11
- E. Wise & Full of Understanding—Deut 4:5-8; Prov 1:1-7; Dan 2:21-22; Ps 19; Eph 5
- F. Strong and Mature—I Co 1:5-8; 2:6-7Eph 4:12-15; 6:10-16; IJn 2:14;2:6-7; Heb 5:12-14
- G. Unshakable and Immoveable—Ps 16:7-8; Heb 12:27-28;
- H. Blessed and Greatly Rewarded—Ps 119:1-2; Pro 3:13-18
- I. Respected and Influential—See Nehemiah (All) & Daniel (All)

#### II. Every One of these Benefits Comes as a Result of Knowing God and His Ways Through the Study of His Word:

- A. Adequate & Equipped for every good work—2 Timothy 3:16-17
- B. Fortified to resist sin and satan—Psalm 119:11; Ephesians 6:10-17
- C. Matured through knowing the Word of God—1 John 2:12-14; Hebrews 5:12-14
- D. Transformed to a Godly perspective by renewing of the mind—Romans 12:1-2
- D. Knowing God through the Word BY the Holy Spirit—I Corinthians 2:1-16

#### III. A Truly Successful Life Does Not Develop by Accident:

- B. Fill your heart with Scripture—Colossians 3:16; Hebrews 4:12
- C. Talk about the Word with family & friends—Deut. 6:6-12; Ephesians 5:19-20
- D. Study the meaning of Scripture passages—2 Timothy 2:14-16; Proverbs 25:2
- E. Seek God through His Word—Rom 10:17; with Heb 11:6; Jn 5:39-40; Lk 24:27

**Conclusion:** The purpose of the Word of God is to reveal the character of God and to expose the problem of sin and rebellion. God promises a life of joy and peace, of true success and strength of character for those who pursue a relationship with Him through diligent study of His Word. It is not knowing the Bible that insures a quality life, it is knowing God. But the knowledge of God comes through the revelation of His nature and His will found in His Word. It is impossible to mature in our walk with Christ and to make the choices that lead to true success if we fail to build God's Word into our heart.

## DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- 1.) What is the purpose of the Bible?
  - 2.) List some ways that you can build God's Word into your life?
  - 3.) Not everyone learns the same way; discuss some different ways to learn and memorize Scripture.
  - 4.) What is it essential to believe that the Bible is 100% true and authoritative.
  - 5.) Discuss your thoughts about God's desire for your success. Have you thought in those terms before?
  - 6.) With what attitudes and mind set should you approach the Bible in order to draw closer to God?
  - 7.) How does the Bible renew our mind and fortify us against sin and deception?

## Suggested Use of this Study Guide

If you do not already have a method of Bible reading and study, consider taking the next four weeks and using this study guide as a template:

Look up all of the passages of Scripture listed and jot down what they say about the Word of God. Ask God, as you study, to build into your heart a love for His Word and a desire to come to know Him as you study. Read the books of Nehemiah and Daniel for biographical insight—what can you learn about them. Is anything negative ever said about their lives? What practices made up their character?
