One of our meetings was devoted to explaining this window, which is an age group which has been targeted by missiologists around the world as being one of the most significant groups to reach in these last days before Christ's return. Our Christmas Tea is always an event to which unbelieving women are invited with the knowledge that the good news of Christ's coming will be clearly presented. Over the years a number of women who are not followers of Christ have consistently attended. Join with us in praying that the eyes of their heart will be open to God's love in Christ. At least seventeen women are attending the Bible studies on the person and work of the Holy Spirit that are sponsored by Alliance Women. It is encouraging to let the Holy Spirit teach us about His role in our lives and to share together what is being learned.

Crossroads Care Center Ministry

Ministry to the residents revolves around an informal chapel service scheduled to meet at 2pm on the 3rd Sunday of each month. Prior to the start of the chapel service, the ministry team visits residents in their rooms inviting them to the service. At times, there may be opportunities to pray with residents in their rooms or encourage them in Jesus should they be unable to attend the service. The Alliance ministry team consists of Frank, Carol, Konrad and Maren, and Rahn. In recent months we have been experiencing a number of relatively new residents participating, several of whom know Jesus. Our gatherings are characterized by a sense of receptivity to the truth of Christ as we boldly proclaim Him in song, testimony, through the reading of Scripture, and the preaching of the Gospel. It is not uncommon for residents to express how much the meeting time means to them. To God be the glory! This year, one resident and his girlfriend, who lives off site, prayed to receive Jesus as their Savior outside of the context of the chapel service. Praise the Lord!

Prayer requests would be as follows:

- That God would work powerfully in the lives of each resident and staff member drawing them to saving faith in Jesus.

Our faith promise is \$20,090! From March 1 to Oct 31, 2012 we have given \$14,702 to missions so far.

The Nursery has been open every Sunday at both the 8am and 10am services this year. We have had many ups and downs with our volunteer staffing requirements but the Lord has been faithful in providing enough willing hands to keep the nursery open. The Nursery accommodates children ages 0-4 and is offering a preschool curriculum as well as free play time. Curriculum this year has been the David C. Cook curriculum that we already purchased a number of years ago. We are considering a curriculum change to the new Discipleland Nursery Curriculum.

We have offered Children's Education Manual training numerous times throughout the year to accommodate new volunteers and have continued to process Children's Worker Applications and Renewal Applications. We have also worked closely with Rowena, who heads Children's Ministries this year, to coordinate our efforts with the K-5 class, youth group and Family Vacation Bible School.

In Fiscal Year 2012-13, we will focus on updating the nursery with a new area rug and look into purchasing a new bound carpet remnant. We have also changed the volunteer scheduling to offer a more consistent presentation of the curriculum to our 2-4 year olds.

Prayer requests for the nursery include more willing hands to come forward and serve, wisdom and guidance as we deal with behavior issues and challenges and God's blessings on these little ones as they begin to experience and learn God's kindness through the hands of our volunteers.

We currently have 70 people enrolled in seven small groups; one group meeting on Sunday evening, two meeting on Monday evening, one on Tuesday afternoon, two groups meeting on Thursday evening, and one group meeting on Friday evening.

The 70 people currently enrolled in the ministry represent 58% of our total potential adult members and regular attendees at the Alliance Bible Church. This is down from a high of 62% in 2009.

For the seven small groups we are averaging a weekly attendance of 25. This is 36% of the total enrolled.

Average attendance among the seven groups ranges from four per meeting to ten.
