God's Word—The Key to All Success

Joshua 1: 8

Introduction: In the consideration of our core values it is inevitable that a high value and respect for God's written Word will be included.  - 2. The dynamic Word is the page of the written Word come to life as the Holy Spirit breathes it freshly into our lives and circumstances. As we seek God in His Word He will meet us and teach us, speaking to the issues and questions of our life.

B. The Bible is Adequate for Life's Many Issues

- It is profitable for teaching—it explains many mysteries of life and instructs us concerning our choices.
- It is profitable for reproof & correction—when we find ourselves in trouble because of poor choices we have made, the teaching of Scripture exposes our sin, reveals our motives, and leads us back to the right path.
- 3. It is profitable for training in righteousness—the Bible is an infallible moral guide that reveals the character of God and articulates what Holy Spirit-filled living looks like.

IV. The Treasure of Scripture (Psalm 19:7-11)

- A. The Bible is worth living for and dying for—many have given their lives to make it available and accessible to every person in every place and language
- B. It should be treasured in our heart (Ps 119:11) by memorization and meditation
- C. It should be a part of our daily nourishment as we eat of it in God's presence (Ps 19:10b)
- D. It should shape our thinking and transform our world view and us (Romans 12:1-2)
- E. It is our source of comfort and encouragement as we learn the promises of God
