## Isaiah 2:1-5 A Vision of the Millennial Reign of the Messiah

Isaiah has a great deal of prophecy concerning the end of the age and the second coming of the Messiah. These early chapters, as we learned last week, are a preliminary overview of the entire prophecy of Isaiah. These first five verses of chapter two give a brief but profound glimpse into the future age and then quickly, in verse six, revert to the present apostasy of Judah and Jerusalem with that message running to the end of chapter five. In this study we will consider only the future of "the last days" (a prophetic term used only here in Isaiah).
